



#### Death <u>Without</u> a Will

- Death without a will
  - People who die without a will, die "intestate"
  - An Administrator is appointed to take charge of intestate's property
  - The Administrato, v. I use estate to pay off debts
  - Remaind of property will be distributed in accordance to state's intestacy statute
  - Usually calls for a surviving spouse to receive one third to one half of estate with remainder divided among children

#### Holographic & Nuncupative Wills

- Special Types of Wills
  - Holographic Will: one that vas written entirely by the decedent's own hand and signed by him or her
  - Nuncupcive Will: Oral Will

#### Activity: Make Your Own Will


